

Agatha Christie

(1890-1976) The Queen of Crime



Agatha Christie is the most widely published author of all time, outsold only by the Bible and Shakespeare. The author of 79 crime novels, 19 plays and six novels, written under the name of Mary Westmacott, Agatha Christie was born in Torquay the youngest of three children. She never went to school, being taught by a governess and tutors. A shy child, unable to adequately express her feelings, she turned, in later life, to writing as means of expression.

Among some of her most popular works were: Murder on the Orient Express, Death on the Nile and her most famous play of all, The Mousetrap, the longest running play in history.

Her work has been translated into more than 100 languages. In 1971 she was awarded the high honour of becoming a Dame of the British Empire, acknowledged Queen of the Golden Age.






