H.E. Bates



Herbert Ernest Bates was born in May 1905, in Rushden, Northamptonshire.

His first novel, *The Two Sisters* was probably inspired by his love of long midnight walks around the countryside in Northamptonshire whilst working during the day time, briefly, for the local newspaper, in Wellingborough, and then in the local shoe factory.

During the second World War he was commissioned to write a series of novels for the RAF, under the name of "Flying Officer X". Under his own name he wrote Fair Stood The Wind For France (his best war novel).


In 1947, his novel *The Purple Plain* was made into a film staring Gregory Peck.

One year, whilst on holiday in Kent, Bates observed a local character, in a shop, purchasing Easter eggs and ice cream, with a huge wad of banknotes, for his many children all seated in a trailer behind his van, and "Pa Larkin" was born in the novel *The Darling Buds of May*, and it's sequel *My Uncle Silas*. The success of the TV series of these books sadly only came after Bate's death in January 1974.

Other novels included Love of Lydia, The Jacaranda Tree, The Day of The Tortoise and many many more.






Matthew Woodhams Director


