

RAY COONEY

began his theatrical career as a boy actor in *Song* of *Norway* at the Palace Theatre in 1946. He served his apprenticeship by playing various repertory companies from Worthing to Blackburn before graduating to Brian Rix's company at the Whitehall Theatre in 1956.

He has written 15 plays for stage, screen and radio, he has acted in 18 plays in the West End and America and has similarly directed an amazing 63 shows around the world. Today Ray Cooney is recognized theatrically and publicly as 'the master of farce' and many of his writings have been translated into more than 40 foreign languages including Chinese, Japanese and Russian. He teamed up with John Chapman in the sixties and seventies, at which time together they wrote some of their greatest successes... Chase Me Comrade, My Giddy Aunt, Not Now Darling and Move Over Mrs Markham written in 1971.

JOHN CHAPMAN

trained initially as an actor at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art. After three years, he decided to write for the theatre instead. His first play *Dry Rot* opened at the Whitehall Theatre, London in 1954 and was a resounding success, running for three and a half years, a total of 1,475 performances.

He has in all, written 27 plays for the stage, but is known equally for his connection with the BBC, having written over 200 comedies for BBC and Thames television, writing for many famous comedy actors and actresses such as June Whitfield and Terry Scott.

As noted above he and Ray Cooney, had a very successful writing partnership with a series of long-running London shows to show for it. John Chapman is married to Actress Betty Impey and they have four sons.






