In the SDC span the Club's time at the 'Little', from my great -uncle helping to found the Club in 1937, to my Dad's chairmanship this season. The SDC has played an important part in my life since as long as I can remember - I've spent many happy hours at the 'Little' and met some very special people.

Christmas wasn't Christmas when I was growing up without my annual visit to the SDC panto, written and directed by Margaret Mann, with Ray Mann as the Dame, Phil Greenwood (then Steve Woods) as the sidekick, Barry Johnson as the Squire, and Pat Ball as the Wicked Witch. Every year, standing on stage for the song sheet, I was fascinated to see everything up close. Even better, one year my cub scout group was invited to look backstage at all the costumes, wigs and scenery. From that moment on, I was hooked, and being around a theatre has fascinated me ever since.

I would badger my parents each season to take me with them to see all the plays, oblivious to the fact that their monthly theatre visit was their night out away from us kids. One play plus pantomime was their annual concession! However the shows I did see gave me the chance to watch many fantastic actors who have sadly either since died or left Southport - Don Anderson, Derek Home, Brian Tooley, Jean Braithwaite, John Evans to name but a few. This was the nearest thing I got to professional theatre - you could always rely on the SDC to produce first class plays and

pantomimes. I kept scrapbooks of all their productions, and was fascinated by the production photographs displayed outside the theatre.

Given my feelings for the SDC, imagine my joy in 1986 when I was asked to perform in my first SDC show, as 'John Darling' in Peter Pan alongside many of the performers I had admired over the years. My parents, ever keen to 'do the right thing', promptly joined the Club to 'legitimise' the casting. They still blame me for getting them involved!! Things came full circle in 1993 when I was cast as the Prince in Sleeping Beauty alongside Ray and Pat, written and directed by Margaret. I remember going on stage and thinking of all the kids in the audience feeling as I had done 10 years before. I don't know who was more excited!!

Reseating of the Auditorium

After several months of planning, the decision has been taken, and the order made, to replace the original '1937' seats with more comfortable, slightly roomier models. The work will take place during the summer recess so that we shall start the 2008-09 season with a beautiful auditorium, refurbished with crimson seats and stage curtain. The layout will follow our traditional configuration despite the debate that this aroused. However, as the new seats are slightly higher than those they replace, patrons seated on the front rows will have an improved view of the stage; all the other sight-lines will remain as at present.


There will be one noticeable change. The passageway across the back of the auditorium will be no more. On advice from the Fire Protection Officer, patrons will use only the doorways and aisles which lead directly to or from their seats. The new layout removes the present problem which allows patrons, as they leave, to mill around the back of the auditorium rather than exit through the appropriate foyer doorway.

Next season, new front of house procedures will be in place to oversee this major change. The new configuration will also mean that we shall have a slightly greater capacity and that the two locations for the use of patrons in wheel-chairs will be better placed for all concerned.

Of course, the seat-names, which are currently in place, will be transferred to the new seating. However, as it is eight years since we have given members and patrons the opportunity to become involved in this scheme, I shall be delighted to receive requests from those of you who would like to become part of the history of our much loved Little Theatre. Please contact me via our Theatre Manager, John Porter, (504800). The cost to you will be: Single Name-£150; Double Name- £200. Naturally, new plaques can only be placed on seats which are presently undesignated.

Finally, whilst the Repairs and Renewals subcommittee members have all contributed to the planning of this latest refurbishment of our theatre, principally, our thanks must go to Charles Preston and Arnold Gorse, who have lead the initiative.




During the theatre's 2008 closed season the old original seats will be replaced with new comfortable, roomier seats giving patrons an improved view of the stage




The new configuration will give a larger seating capacity with two locations for Patrons in wheelchairs
