### Biography of John Buchan, Patrick Barlow, Alfred Hitchcock, Simon Corble and Nobby Dimon

#### John Buchan

This play of *The 39 Steps* is the work of a number of people. It was adapted from John Buchan's 1915 book and Alfred Hitchcock's 1935 film, and written by Patrick Barlow from a concept by Simon Corble and Nobby Dimon. John Buchan was born in 1875 in Perth. Scotland, his father was a Calvinist Presbyterian minister. He went to Hutchesons' Grammar School, the University of Glasgow and studied at Oxford. After Oxford Buchan balanced a writing career with a career in public life. He went on to write over a hundred books. The spythriller The 39 Steps, which was set in the years before World War I, was one of his most famous works. From 1935 until his death in 1940. Buchan was Governor-General of Canada.

#### Patrick Barlow

Patrick Barlow rewrote the script for a stage adaptation in 2004. He was born in 1947 and is a playwright as well as a comedian and actor. Barlow is most well-known for his amusing two-man National Theatre of Brent, which has appeared on theatre, television and radio. He has also had cameo roles in the films Shakespeare in Love (1998), Notting Hill (1999) and Bridget Jones's Diary (2001).

#### Alfred Hitchcock

The 39 Steps was filmed by Hitchcock in 1935, who changed much of the plot, and also added the female character of Pamela played by Madeleine Carroll. Robert Donat portrayed the lead role of Richard Hannay. The 39 Steps was one of Hitchcock's earlier films. He would go on to direct over fifty films over his life. Hitchcock moved to Hollywood in 1939 to continue his career there. Some of his most famous films include North by Northwest, Vertigo and Psycho.

He died in 1980 in Bel Air, California.

#### Simon Corble and Nobby Dimon

It was years later in 1995/96, that Simon Corble and Nobby Dimon created the stage version of the Buchan/Hitchcock tale. Corble describes himself on his internet home page as a director, performer and writer. He studied at Manchester Polytechnic, lives in Monyash in the Peak District and is from Manchester. He says on his Facebook page: "I met Nobby Dimon while devising a piece for Harrogate Theatre in 1995, and being a life-long Buchan and Hitchcock fan. immediately offered my services as writer and co-director for the team creating the original 39 Steps. This triumphantly toured village halls and small theatres before continuing on its remarkable road to world-wide success."

## A Closer look at Barlow's Adaptation of The 39 Steps

Patrick Barlow's adaptation of *The 39 Steps* was premiered at the West Yorkshire Playhouse, Leeds on June 17th 2005. There are lots of different parts in the play, but only four actors play all the roles.

Richard Hannay, the central character of the show, is played by one actor.

Another plays Hannay's female love interests. The other parts in the show are portrayed by the other two actors.

Barlow's play also has many amusing moments, and it makes references to different Hitchcock films. It has often been likened to Monty Python, and Barlow's *National Theatre of Brent*.

The production is based more on the film than the book. Hannay's speech, which was developed by Hitchcock from the book, is extended by Barlow.

It went on a successful national tour and opened in London on August 10th 2006 at The Tricycle Theatre (London), and was called John Buchan's The 39 Steps. The play was directed by Maria Aitken and the London Premiere starred Charles Edwards. Rupert Degas, Simon Gregor and Catherine McCormack. In September 2006, the production moved to the Criterion Theatre in London's West End. The 39 Steps can still be seen at the Criterion today, and is

going on a nationwide tour from January to July next year. The play won Patrick an *Olivier* award. The same year it also picked up the *What's on Stage Award for Best Comedy 2007*.

Theatre critics in New York raved when the production opened on Broadway in January 2008 at the American Airlines Theatre. It had seven hundred and seventy-one performances and closed in January 2010. During this time it co-won a Drama Desk Award, and received two Tonys.

The play opens in London before the Second World War in 1935, and the audience is introduced to Richard Hannay, who is in his apartment....










## The Flying Scotsman

The Flying Scotsman is the name given to the railway express passenger service linking London and Edinburgh since 1862, it is currently run by East Coast. Two trains departed simultaneously at 10:00 a.m. from London Kings Cross and Edinburgh Waverley stations.

Originally the trip took ten and a half hours, including a half-hour stop at York for lunch. As rail technology improved this

reduced to eight and a half hours! It soon became possible for travellers to


lunch on board the train so the York stop reduced to fifteen minutes. In 1928 the run became 'non-stop' with the use of corridor tenders through which a relief crew could reach the engine from the front carriage. The modern service only travels south and takes four hours and nineteen minutes. There is no longer a northbound service.

The rolling stock and locos have changed dramatically over the years. The amazing Gresley Pacifics carried passengers from the 1920's to the 1950's when dieselisation brought in the mighty Class 55 Deltics. Steam and diesel locos have figured prominently in advertisements for the service. In order to further the 'fame' of the service it was decided to name a loco which had seen sterling service pulling the trains Flying Scotsman. Another famous locomotive that pulled this service is the world speed record holder Mallard, both these engines are now preserved at the National Rail Museum, York

This locomotive was built in 1923 for the *London & North Eastern Railway* at their Doncaster works, in its service career it clocked up more than 2,000,000 Miles!




