


Director's notes

I cannot miss the opportunity of thanking everyone who has helped to put this production together, far too many to mention individually but they know who they are.


Also a big thank you to you our audience without whom all our hard work would be pointless.


So sit back, relax and laugh along with us at the antics you could only witness at a hotel called *Fawlty Towers*.

John Cleese & Connie Booth

John Cleese wrote *Fawlty Towers* with his first wife Connie Booth. They both starred in the sitcom, John Cleese as Basil Fawlty and Connie Booth as the maid Polly.

Cleese was born in Westonsuper Mare on October 27, 1939. At school he was picked on because of his height, he was six foot at the age of twelve; he used humour to deal with the people teasing him. He studied at Cambridge University, where he read law and was involved with the University's Footlights group. Graham Chapman, who later worked with Cleese on Monty Python's Flying Circus, was also a Footlight's member.

After graduating Cleese was a writer and performer on *The Frost Report* (1966) and in 1969 he joined with Eric Idle, Terry

Gilliam, Terry Jones, Chapman and Michael Palin to help write and appear in *Monty Python's Flying Circus*, which was an influential comedy series. The team were also responsible for a number of films including: *Monty Python and the Holy Grail* (1975) and *Life of Brian* (1979). He has also appeared in the following movies: *Clockwise* (1986), *A Fish Called Wanda*

(1988), two James Bond films and Harry Potter films. He has been married four times and is best known for playing uptight or comic characters.

Connie Booth is an American writer and actress. She was born in Indianapolis in 1944. She played a number of roles in Monty Python's Flying Circus and starred in Monty Python and the Holy Grail. She often used her American accent in parts such as Mrs Errol in a BBC television production of Little Lord Fauntleroy in 1980. Connie Booth was married to John Cleese from 1968 to 1978 and they have a daughter, Cynthia.

Connie Booth retired from acting in 1995 to be a psychotherapist in London.

Fawlty Towers

John Cleese was inspired to write Fawlty Towers after staying at the Gleneagles Hotel in Torquay. He had been filming on location in May 1971 with the Monty Python team when he became intrigued with the hotel owner, Donald Sinclair. Cleese has described Sinclair as "the rudest man I've ever come across in my life." During the Python's visit, Sinclair put Eric Idle's briefcase in the garden because he was worried it might be a bomb. After filming stopped Cleese and his wife, Connie Booth, stayed on longer at the hotel to watch the unusual behaviour of Sinclair.

Cleese wrote *Fawlty Towers* with Booth after he had left Monty Python. There are only twelve episodes of Fawlty Towers as he

did not want to diminish its impact. The first series containing six shows was broadcast on BBC2 between September 19 and October 24, 1975. The second series was shown between February 19 and March 26, 1979. The final episode *Basil the Rat* was not screened until October 25, 1979 because a strike disrupted the making of it.

The main character in Fawlty Towers, who is based on Donald Sinclair, is Basil Fawlty and he is equally as rude with his guests. Other characters included Basil's wife Sybil, played by Prunella Scales, a chambermaid Polly (Connie Booth) and the waiter from Barcelona, Manuel (Andrew Sachs). The sitcom is set in the seaside town of Torquay.

When the first series started the critics were not very impressed. but by the time it finished they were more appreciative. At the time the public could not mention waiters and Barcelona without sniggering. Fawlty Towers received recognition at the British Academy of Film and Television Arts awards (BAFTAs). Both series won Best Situation Comedy awards and in 1976 Cleese was nominated in the Best Light Entertainment Performance category. Fawlty Towers has now been sold to forty-five television stations in seventeen countries.

The three episodes chosen for tonight's production by the director, Les Gomersall, are: *A Touch of Class, The Hotel Inspectors* and *Communication Problems*.

NOW IN REHEARSAL DAMAGES

I was lucky enough to meet Steve Thompson at last year's LTG conference. Famous now for writing episodes of 'Doctor Who' and 'Sherlock' I jumped at the chance to direct 'Damages', his award winning first play, which premiered at the Bush Theatre in 2004.

Deep in the bowels of a tabloid newspaper office, the clock is ticking with only an hour left before the presses have to roll. A controversial photo of a topless children's TV star has mysteriously turned up. Who sent it? Why? And is it really all it seems? This sensational photo poses a moral conundrum, exposing deceit, lies and a darker secret that mustn't be revealed at any cost.

I am incredibly lucky to be working with an incredibly talented cast. Mike Stowell plays Howard, "the Guardian of Style" who still demands 1950s

values today. Alistair Hewitt is Lister, the hard-nosed Scot with a working-class chip on his shoulder. Inevitably, he jousts with ineffectual, university-educated temporary Night Editor Bas, played by John Delahunty. Laura Ellis completes the cast, playing Abigail, the attractive young night lawyer. She is the outside expert who has been called in to ensure that the libel laws are only breached to the level where the paper will not get sued. With Gay Stowell prompting, I really do have a fantastic team. Please come and support them but be warned the play does contain VERY strong language and one of the best twists in contemporary theatre!

"Damages" is a witty and contemporary (im)morality tale of power-hungry hacks, suicidal sub editors and razor-sharp lawyers, trying to put the past and the paper to bed.


