

### DIRECTOR'S NOTES

I was delighted to be asked to direct 'A Servant to Two Masters'. It is not often, as amateur directors, we get to work with such classic material. This script, originally written in 1743. has been adapted by the wonderful Lee Hall whose other work includes the screenplays for 'Billy Elliot' and 'War Horse'. His madcap interpretation of this great Italian comedy of errors has everything: lovers, lawyers. servants, masters, rissoles and spotted dick!

Betrothed couple, Silvio and Clarice, are devastated when Clarice's previous fiancé, Florindo reappears, back from the dead. In this wild farce things and people, are not what they seem - disguises, deceptions and tricks produce a whirlwind of mass confusion. At the





centre of this mirth is Truffaldino, the scheming, and perpetually hungry, servant who concocts a zany scheme to double his wages (and his meals) by serving two masters at once.

Their efforts above and beyond the call of duty are very much appreciated. 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### CARLO GOLDONI

Carlo Goldoni was born in 1707 in Venice to parents Margherita and Giulio.

From a young age Goldoni was drawn towards the theatre; as a child his toys were puppets and his books were plays.

In 1723 his father enrolled him at the University of Pavia as a law student. Whilst studying there Goldoni took the tonsure and wore clerical dress. However in his third year at Pavia he composed a poem which made fun of the women of the town and led to his expulsion.

In 1727 he returned to his law studies in Modena and completed his degree. He then worked as a law clerk at Chioggia and Feltre where he questioned suspects, some of whom were under torture. Although Goldoni was settled as a lawyer, he was still attracted to the

theatre. His first work 'Amalasunta' written in 1732 was a failure. In 1734 he was engaged by Grimani to work at the San Samuele Theatre in Venice for the Imer Company. His career as a playwright is dated from this time. In 1736 Goldoni met his wife and lifelong partner, Nicoletta Connio.

His first real comedy was L'umo di mondo ('The Man of the World') written in 1738. In 1750-51 Goldoni wrote sixteen comedies for the season which included some of his masterpieces: 'The Coffeehouse', 'Pamela', 'The Comic Theatre', 'The Liar', 'The Gambler' and 'The True Friend'. Goldoni's fellow playwright, Carlo Gozzi criticised him in 1757 when, in a pamphlet, he accused Goldoni of destroying Italian theatrical tradition.

In 1762 Goldoni accepted an invitation to be in charge of the Comedie Italienne at the Royal Court in Paris, which came with a pension. Goldoni settled in Paris where he wrote plays and his memoirs. In 1765 he wrote 'The Fan' which was his last masterpiece. During the French Revolution Goldoni lost his pension. He died in poverty on February 7th, 1793.

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#### A SERVANT TO TWO MASTERS

This comedy was written in 1743 by the Italian playwright Carlo Goldoni at the request of the actor Antonio Sacchi, one of the great Truffaldinos in history. The original production was staged in Milan. Large sections of the original drafts were kept for improvisation. The revised version produced in 1753 is the version used today. It is recorded that Mozart admired the work and wanted to turn it into a comic opera.

In the play Truffaldino attempts to serve two masters at the same time which results in some amusing consequences. The characters in 'A Servant To Two Masters' come from stock characters in Commedia dell'arte which originated in Venice in the 1600s. It was a well-liked type of street theatre and usually came from improvised scenarios between characters, who were masters, servants and lovers. Commedia dell'arte would be performed by actors who went from town to town wherever they could find an audience.

'A Servant to Two Masters' is not considered to be true Commedia dell'arte because it has a script whereas true Commedia dell'arte is improvised without a script. The play has been performed all over the world. It was adapted by the National Theatre, London, in 2011 in a production called 'One Man, Two Guvnors' written by Richard Bean, with a 1963 Brighton set replacing the Italian setting of 'A Servant To Two Masters'. The hit production also toured the U.K. It opened in the West End in 2011 and Broadway in 2012 and starred James Corden.




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
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
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












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### THE CAST OF '75
