Producer's Note.

In complete contrast to the charm of "Romance" the Southport Dramatic Club offers, as its second production of the season, "An Inspector Calls," one of Mr. J. B. Priestley's latest plays.

First performed in London by the Old Vic Company in their 1946-47 Season (with Sir Ralph Richardson as the Inspector) it is now being played here not only for the first time in Southport but also for the first time by amateurs in this country, having been released only this month.

Although the action of the play is continuous, the set is rotated to give a slightly different background to each of the three acts.

The play offers an attractive combination of naturalism and mysticism. We see a life-like, human family living in 1912 in an English industrial city. And also we see the effect upon them of the visit of a mysterious Inspector, a visit which symbolises the uneasy years which were destined to be our country's lot between 1912 and the present day.


In my production I have endeavoured to lay more emphasis upon Priestley the dramatist than on Priestley the moralist. For while many of his views are undoubtedly controversial, no one can deny that his plays are extremely well constructed, his dialogue is taut and natural, his situations neat and well contrived, and above all his character drawing quite excellent.

In this unusual play, Priestley portrays the hopes and fears, the ideals and differences of opinion of his characters extremely well, resulting in a play of sustained interest which we feel sure our audiences will enjoy.
