

Author's Notes

Richard Harris describes in "Business of Murder" that a playwright's profession requires a warped imagination. As an author he has certainly been blessed with a fertile, if not warped, imagination.

"Business of Murder" ran for over 5 years in the West End and has since been performed, both professionally and by amateurs, from Boston to Bermuda. It was at the time of its premiere, described as "the best thriller in a decade" by the Daily Mail and it is certainly one of the most gripping of recent years.

Another of Richard Harris' thrillers, "Dead Guilty" was performed at the Little Theatre two seasons ago. It is probably for his comedies "Outside Edge", "Party Piece" and "Local Affairs" that Richard Harris is more well known.



The Thirties

- 1930-32 SDC stages four plays a year at the Pier Pavilion.
- 1930 Everyone over 21 gets the vote.
- 1932-36 The Slump. Manual Wages 75p (15/-) per week.
- 1933 SDC Presents "The Barratts of Wimpole Street" at the Garrick Theatre. (shown below)
- 1934-37 SDC stages two plays per year at the Garrick.
- 1934 SDC obtain a clubroom in Mornington Road.
- 1935 New semi-detached house costs £500 in London
- 1935 Liverpool Victoria Friendly Society agrees to build a theatre in Hoghton Street at a cost of £8,500!
- 1936 24th Oct Theatre foundation stone laid.11th Dec Abdication of Edward VIII.Jarrow march
- 30th Sept Little Theatre opens with a production of "Dear Brutus".George VI becomes King.
- 1938 SDC's first season at the Little Theatre Sept - "I believe it is peace for our time" - Neville Chamberlain
- 1939 3rd Sept War declared.Little Theatre closed.
