H.M. Queen Elizabeth II Golden Jubilee – 2002

In her accession speech in 1952, the Queen declared: "I shall always work, as my father did throughout his reign, to uphold the constitutional government and to advance the happiness and prosperity of my peoples, spread as they are all the world over". She spoke of "this heavy task that has been laid upon me so early in life".

It is a task she has undertaken faithfully and unflinchingly through good times and bad for fifty years. The emphasis of the Golden Jubilee is different from that of the Silver Jubilee, twenty-five years ago. If in a sense the nation thanked the Queen in 1977, then in 2002 the Queen wants to thank the nation.

The focus is firmly on the young people of the country, and particularly in schools. The Golden Jubilee is a time to look at the Queen's fifty years, but also to look at all the changes that have occurred in Britain in the last fifty years.

It is an occasion for parties and celebration, for giving to charity in the name of the Queen and a chance for Britain to take stock and to recognise the good fortune of having had fifty years of unstinting service from a constitutional monarch.

During the last few months of rehearsals for "An Absolute Turkey", it became evident that the play we were performing had a definite rhythm and cadence. So when it became time to select music to complement Feydeau's farce we wanted to avoid a background of wallpaper musak.

So what did one choose? Strauss, too Austrian; Lehar, too lyrical and sweet; Sullivan, too English.

No other choice but Offenbach, the Master of Bouffe-Parisien.

Listening to the Boston pops rendering of Gaite Parisien provided a wealth of adaptable music selected from his big six repertoire:- Orphée Aux Ewfers, La Vie Parisienne, Barbe-Bleue, La Grand-Duchesse de Gardstein, La Pérchole, and La Belle Héléne.

Hopefully this selection of music will recreate the period of the Bel-Monde, The Naughty Nineties, Impressionist artists, The Paris Exposition Universelle of 1900 and the Crossroads into a new era that now we look back on with mixed feelings

An enthusiastic cast has been assembled to portray Feydeau's characters, that are required to act with a precision of timing. Proving that playing comedy is a serious business. The result is that their orchestrated rhythm and timing has brought to life the characters created by Georges Feydeau over a hundred years ago.



OEDAGES LEADEUN

Georges Feydeau (1862-1921), the supreme master of farce, devoted his skills to exploding hypocrisy in a very self-important age. "An Absolute Turkey" (Le Dindon) is one of his best loved plays. He displays all his dramatic tricks as the characters are pulled back and forth by an escalating series of complications. This translation received its London premiere at the Globe Theatre in December 1993.

Peter Hall is one of the world's best known theatre directors. He founded the Royal Shakespeare Company in 1960 and from 1973-1988 was director of the Royal national Theatre. With his own Peter Hall Company he has mounted many productions in the West End including "The Merchant of Venice", "The Wild Duck", "The Homecoming", "An Ideal Husband" and "Amadeus".

Nicki Frei has worked as a publicist for both Riverside Studios and the Royal National Theatre. She has written several screenplays for film and television, including an eight part adaptation of Barry Unsworth's novel, "Sacred Hunger".



David left secondary school soon after his fifteenth birthday to start his career in advertising with a Liverpool studio.


His first experience in directing came at the age of seven when his school teacher allowed him to direct his fellow pupils in his version of "Toy Town" and "Wurzel Gummage". He has spent a lifetime as a graphical illustrator and designer and in later years treading the boards in his spare time, once described by his A.S.M. (Book) as the 'Scouse' Prince of Wales in the 1991 SDC production of the "Royal Baccarat Scandal".



Emma Jane Hall (Lucienne)

Emma was very excited about being seen in a corset, unfortunately her role in "The Forsyte Saga" ended up on the cutting room floor, so she begged and pleaded for a role in "An Absolute Turkey".

Emma would like to stress to her father that any removal of clothing during this production is not indicative of a career change - she is still training to be a masseuse.



John Sharp (Pontagnac)

John's last appearance on the Little Theatre Stage was as a 'serious' serial womaniser - "King Henry VIII".

Since taking to the stage six years ago, he has also performed various principal roles with SAOS, Birkdale Orpheus and The Houghton Players.




