

Director's Notes




As we have worked on *Laura* we have come to appreciate what a skilfully crafted play it is.

Vera Caspary & George Sklar

Born on 13th November, 1904 in Chicago, Illinois, American author, playwright and screenwriter, Vera Caspary, began her distinguished career at the age of 18. She dropped out of school in order to work as an advertising copywriter for a mail order company and began writing novels, as a hobby on the side. She began working in Hollywood in the early 30's where she was to meet George Sklar, an already experienced film screenwriter.

Her best known work is the novel *Laura* described today as a classic tale of mystery and suspense. It was soon to become a successful play on Broadway and in 1944, an even more successful film. She did not, however, write the screenplay herself, which was undertaken by her friend George Sklar.

The film of *Laura* was made at Twentieth Century Fox, directed by Otto Preminger with Judith Anderson, Dana Andrews, Vincent Price and Gene Tierney achieving four Academy Award nominations, including one for Best Director. Vera Caspary went on to provide original stories for the films *A Letter to Three Wives* (1949) *The Blue Gardenia* (1953) and *Bachelor in Paradise* (1961).

Sadly, not as much is recorded of life of George Sklar. He was born in 1908 and died at the age of 80 in 1988 in Los Angeles, California, USA. He worked in Hollywood during its most successful and productive years. His professional partnership with Vera Caspary, in the 30's and 40's has more than stood the test of time. The play is still regularly performed and videos of the film *Laura* are available for sale today, nearly 60 years after it was first screened!

It's taken David 12 months since the period drama *The Herbal Bed* for David to revive his enthusiasm for the stage and take a the role made famous by Dana Andrews.


Unfortunately the leisure time between has not seen a significant reduction in his golf handicap.

Simon is enjoying his first thriller, playing the role of Shelby. Yet again he has been typecast in a role that demands a foreign accent and a stage-managed punch up. Earlier in the year he played the Sheriff of Nottingham in the SDC's Pantomime and the dual roles of Colin Soridin and the voice of Obidiah Llewellyn in Noel Coward's "Nude with Violin".



Mandy Evans (Bessie Clary)

Mandy's last appearance for the SDC was in *Loot* a bar production and although her part as Bessie, in *Laura* is much smaller she has thoroughly enjoyed working with an excellent cast and director.

Last year she was fortunate enough to play the part of Doctor Susan Booth in the Harold Shipman drama (on TV) and she is looking forward to appearing in the SDC Pantomime *Cinderella* this christmas
