Director's Notes



Traditionally, pantomime is a Christmas entertainment intended particularly for the young. It is an art form that the rest of the world thinks is peculiarly British, claiming, in a puzzled fashion, not to understand it at all. Like Punch and Judy, Harlequinade and the French tradition of mime, its origins can be traced back to the 16th and 17th century Italian improvised comic drama, commedia dell'arte.

Cinderella was first performed at Drury Lane in 1804 and with its rags to riches storyline, the wonderfully wicked evil sisters and a fairy godmother who can turn pumpkins into coaches it remains one of the most popular and enduring of tales.

Once again, I am delighted to have been involved in another SDC pantomime. I am also delighted to be working with such a huge cross-section of our membership. I am indebted to my talented production team, my enthusiastic cast, the hard-working stage crew and everyone else who has helped get Cinders to the ball before midnight. Stephen Hughes-Alty




In each programme this season, there has been a page dedicated to the author of the play being presented. Tonight's production has been penned by one of our members and just because he is not as famous as Alan Ayckbourn or Noel Coward (yet) we thought we'd offer him the same courtesy.

Stephen Hughes-Alty started his theatrical journey when he was just 11 years old. He appeared in S.O.N.G's production of *The Boyfriend* before taking the title role in *Oliver* the following year. Then, there followed over 300 productions where Stephen played such diverse roles as Mercutio in *Romeo and Juliet* and Albin in *La Cage aux Folles*.

After attending the University of Kent, he took his drama degree and started the successful WYSIWYG Theatre Company. As Artistic Director he wrote and directed several *Murder Nights* as well as taking part in several regional tours.

He collaborated on the SDC pantomime of *The Babes in the Wood* (1998) before writing and directing *Dick Whittington* (1999) and *Sleeping Beauty* (2000). His other works include *The Hotspot*, a musical for children, and *Grim Hotel* a surreal horror story.

He is currently Co-ordinator for Performing Arts at Bispham High School Arts College in Blackpool. His essays on drama education have appeared in several publications and he has a book on drama teaching coming out in 2004.




Guy Unsworth (Dandini)
