Notes on the Author



Ray Cooney

Ray Cooney began his theatrical career as a boy actor in *Song of Norway* at the Palace Theatre in 1946. He served his apprenticeship by playing various repertory companies from Worthing to Blackburn before graduating to Brian Rix's company at the Whitehall Theatre in 1956. He later began a writing career which, to date, has produced 17 West End plays including *Not Now Darling*, *Move Over Mrs Markham*, *There Goes the Bride* (all cowritten with John Chapman), *Chase Me Comrade*, *Run For Your Wife*, *Out of Order*, *It Runs in the Family* and *Funny Money*.

As Producer and Director he has been responsible for over 30 London productions, including Lloyd George Knew My Father, Whose Life is it Anyway?, Chicago and Children of a Lesser God.

In 1983, Ray formed the Theatre of Comedy Company (bringing together the founder members consisting of 30 West End stars) and he became its first Artistic Director. During Ray's tenure the company produced over 20 plays including Run For Your Wife, Out of Order, Two into One and the acclaimed revivals of See How They Run, Loot, When We are Married and Pygmalion starring Peter O' Toole and the late John Thaw.

Today, Ray Cooney is recognized theatrically and publicly as 'the master of farce' and a most worthy successor, as an author, to the great Ben Travers, and as a director/actor to Brian Rix. his comedies and farces have been translated into more than 40 foreign languages including Chinese, Japanese and Russian. During his hectic theatrical career he has always found time to continue acting, and recently played in the last year of Run For Your Wife in London before appearing in the New York production.

Ray has been married to his wife, Linda for 35 years and has two sons, Danny and Michael. Michael has inherited his father's gift and also writes plays. Danny, his eldest son, lives in Australia with his wife and two children.

Ted's first performances were as assistant to the only female Human Cannon Ball and escapologist in Britain, 'Firecracker Freda', until a government enterprise scheme brought another dozen forward. However, Frieda remained the only one north of Watford, "You can tie, chain and rope me, I'll be out before the milk boils over" was her boast, and often she was. Ted last saw her at the Lakeland Carnival in Coniston Water. She had always said Ted was heavy with the gunpowder; (If you believe this you will believe anything) Ed.

After that Ted took to the stage, and studied all the experts on creating characters such as Stanislavsky, Dick Van Dyke and Walt Disney. Ralph Richardson once said "It took twenty years to become an actor", if that's true, Ted wonders, who's going to play Little Lord Fauntleroy? In this play Ted plays a man with two wives, which is big of him, considering he is described as: quite average, ordinary really. Ted still can't work out why he was cast in this role.

Norman is very pleased to be appearing in another Ray Cooney farce, following *It Runs in the Family* and *Funny Money*, all be it as yet another policeman. At least this time he has a lot more to say than in his last role, as Olsen in *Laura* last season.
