Director's Notes



As I stood in the empty auditorium, listening to the rain pour onto the stage of this theatre through the huge hole in the roof, I could hear behind me the laughter of the audience. The play was *The Anniversary* and the year 1988. The audience were sitting in the temporary auditorium we had built in the foyer following the fire which had badly damaged the stage and auditorium on the night of 1st January that year.

I have special memories of the year as I happened to be Chairman of the SDC at the time. The auditorium had raked seating (thanks to innumerable pallets) for 120 people. As we couldn't seat all our regular patrons we extended play runs and even added an extra production to show we were still very much in business.

It gives me a great sense of satisfaction now to direct that play. It is an unusual piece, combining as it does the very strong characterisations often found in "heavier" works with moments of high comedy. Strongest of all, the monstrous Mum is the puppeteer for all the other characters. We hope you enjoy seeing her version of love - just as we fervently hope that you never experience anything like it.



Items of news that occurred in 1966, the year in which tonight's play is set.

- January 19th Mrs Indira Gandhi became Prime Minister of India.
- April 8th Leonid Brezhnev became General Secretary of the Soviet Union.
- May Ian Brady and Myra Hindley (died 2002 in prison) were jailed for life for the murder of at least three children in the 'Moors murders' case.
 Such was public feeling at the time, hanging had just been abolished, that the defendants had to be protected by bullet proof glass in the court.
- July 30th England defeated West Germany, 4-2, at soccer to win the Jules Rimet World Cup at Wembley (after extra time). Geoff Hurst scored three of England's goals.
- August 13th Mao Tse-tung proclaimed a 'cultural revolution' in China.
- October 21st 116 children and 48 adults were killed when a coal waste tip collapsed and buried their school in Aberfan, Wales.
- November 9th Art treasures damaged and hundreds died in Italy by the worst storms in 700 years. The streets of Florence became raging torrents.
- Another General Election where Labour were returned to power. They
 made cuts in foreign currency allowances and imposed a pay and wages
 freeze.
- Freddie Laker started an airline for cheap package holidays abroad.
- Rising inflation was a deterrent for savers but the first credit card, Barclaycard, was introduced making spending easier.
- The War Game was banned by BBC because of its graphic illustration of a nuclear attack on Britain.
- The film Cathy Come Home was broadcast on TV. The story of a homeless mother provoked outcries in Britain and the charity Shelter was formed.
- British Guiana became independent as Guyana.






